
# World Book Dav

### Safeguarding

### CPOMS

CPOMS stands for Child Protection Online Monitoring System and is used across the Federation for monitoring child protection, safeguarding and pastoral and welfare issues. CPOMS provides our safeguarding team with a system to help with the management of child protection, behavioural issues, bullying, and additional educational needs. Every member of staff across school has a responsibility to report any concerns which they may have. CPOMS allows this information to be



recorded on an online secure system which alerts relevant staff immediately. All staff can record their concerns only designated staff have access to the information stored. Senior leaders are able to build a chronology around a student and can produce reports for Case Conference Meetings, Governors and other professionals very easily. Our trust (LDLT) has published a CPOMS Handbook setting out the expectations of all staff regarding how the CPOMS system is used across the trust. LDLT guidance ensures clarity and transparency across the trust. As part of this policy there is a list of agreed categories that are currently used with a brief definition of what they are used for, and who will be automatically notified of the events. As in the Federation categories have restricted access and therefore are only visible to those with DSL or SEND responsibilities.

## Attendance Absence Reporting Reminder

If your child is absent from school due to illness, please telephone school on 01765 602858 and inform the office staff ideally between 8.30 and 9am. If your child's illness lasts for more than one day, you must phone school daily and inform us why your child is still absent. If your child's illness lasts longer than 48hrs and you have not already done so, we advise you to seek medical attention. If you do not inform school and we cannot make contact, a member of the leadership team may visit your home to check all is well and ask why your child is absent from school. It is very important that you contact school and inform us why your child is absent. If we do not hear from you, we will be concerned and may make a referral to outside agencies.


