Internet Safety

Our new website has a whole page dedicated to the safety of children online. We designate a significant proportion of time in school to the planning and delivery of age-appropriate online safety education. Part of the most recent requirements that schools must meet are their responsibilities for **filtering and monitoring** systems. In school, we currently use a system call 'Smoothwall' as our provider for filtering unwanted online materials and preventing them making their way onto school systems. This system also supports us in monitoring unwanted materials – including where they have originated from and what was searched online to attract these unwanted materials. There are very clear systems and procedures in place in school, designed to allow pupils the freedom to utilise the undoubted opportunities that the internet provides, whilst also ensuring their experience is a safe one!
