Children's Mental Health Week

Mental health is as important to a child's safety and wellbeing as their physical health. It can impact on all aspects of their life, including their physical wellbeing, relationships and educational attainment. Mental health can also change over time, to varying degrees of seriousness, and for different reasons.

[Children's Mental Health Week](#) is an awareness week that aims to empower children and young people in the UK. The week is hosted by the children's charity Place2Be. The theme for 2025 is Know Yourself, Grow Yourself, with the aim to equip and empower children and young people across the UK to embrace self-awareness and explore what it means to them. We want children and young people to discover how getting to know who they are can help them build resilience, grow and develop.

Place2Be's Children's Mental Health Week has joined forces with Here4You to explore the importance of self-awareness and expressing emotions. Here4You is supported by The Walt Disney Company, and through the characters of Pixar's *Inside Out 2*, the resources encourage children and young people across the UK to discover how getting to know who they are can help them build resilience, grow and develop.
