Our curriculum provides a progressive development of knowledge and skills building on prior learning.

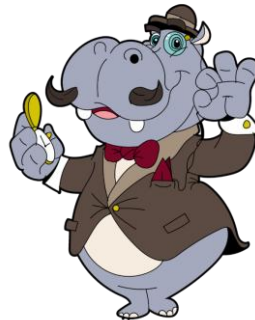


Our curriculum is reinforced through enrichment opportunities that fosters all pupils' talents and develops cultural capital: we are part of a wider Christian and global community.

Foundation Stage Curriculum

Our Early Year Foundation Stage follows the curriculum as outlined in the latest version of the [EYFS statutory framework \(December 2023\)](#).

All seven areas of learning and development are important and interconnected.

Three areas are particularly crucial for igniting children's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning, and for building their capacity to learn, form relationships and thrive, both in the EYFS and into Key Stage 1. These three areas are the **prime areas**:

- ✓ Communication and Language
- ✓ Physical Development
- ✓ Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children are also supported through the **four specific areas**, through which the three prime areas are strengthened and applied:

- ✓ If your child wets or soils themselves, they will be changed by a member of staff. If your child appears upset or distressed a member of staff will call you.
