We are delighted to share our new school logo! We have kept the trinity symbol at the heart of it to show our affiliation to Holy Trinity Church. The inner triquetra, also known as a trinity knot, in the centre, represents the Holy Trinity: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit and Lord over all the universe. The twists and turns of the trinity knot symbolise the timeless nature of the human spirit. With no beginning and no end, the trinity knot is a sign of eternal life and of God's never-ending love. The inter woven circle represents the notions of the infinite, eternity, timelessness, movement of God.

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#### **Poppies**

We are proud to support the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. Our Year Six pupils will be selling poppies alongside as a range of merchandise every day before and after school from Monday 6<sup>th</sup> November until Friday 10<sup>th</sup> November. 


Meet Claude! Claude is a computer scientist.

I am very excited to reveal to you that in response to parental and staff feedback we have revised our approach to SEND Support planning and how we communicate these with families. We have invested in a new interactive platform which will go live after half term to allow a shared space for all SEND Support Plans and linked documentation which both school and home can access at their convenience.

Once I have received confirmation of the launch date from the provider, I will lead a parent information session where I explain the processes and procedures linked to the new interactive platform and answer any questions. I will also distribute a recorded session for those families who cannot attend. Once plans are live, meetings to discuss these with class teachers and/or myself would be welcomed.

Please ensure your child's uniform is named. Our lost property cupboard fills up very quickly and it really does help if we can reunite the jumpers and cardigans with their owners!


