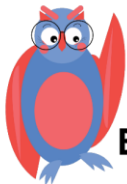
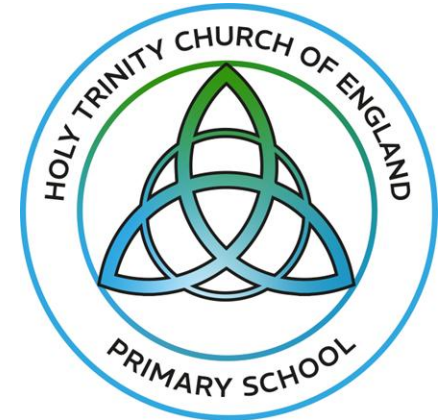

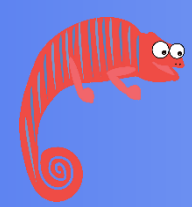

These are **five values** that the Government decided are **important** to people living in the **UK today**.





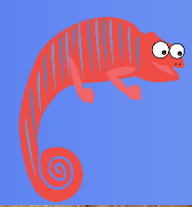
Be informed: What's the meaning?

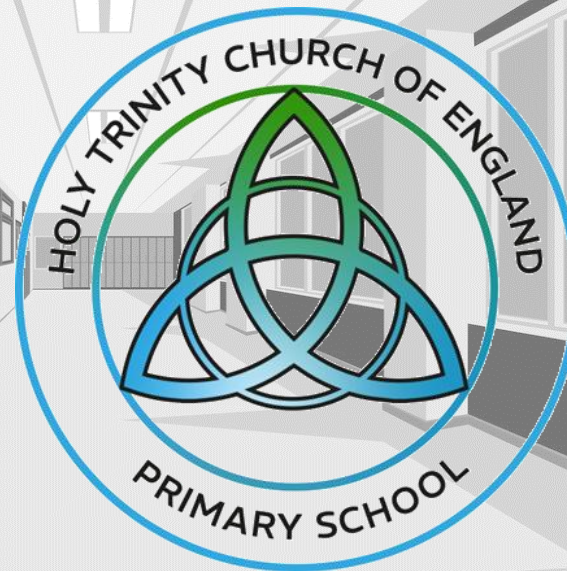


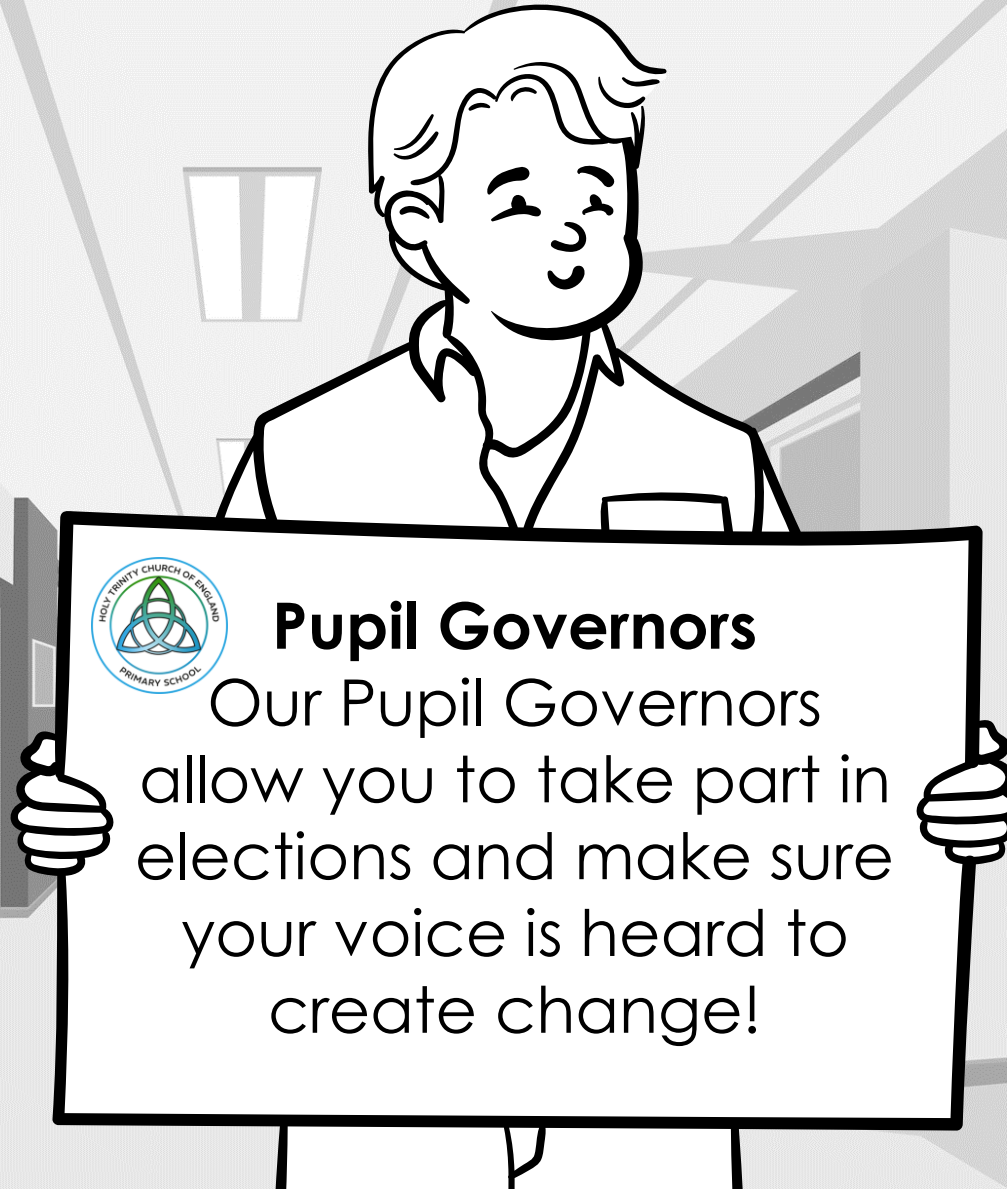
Be heard: Everyday values

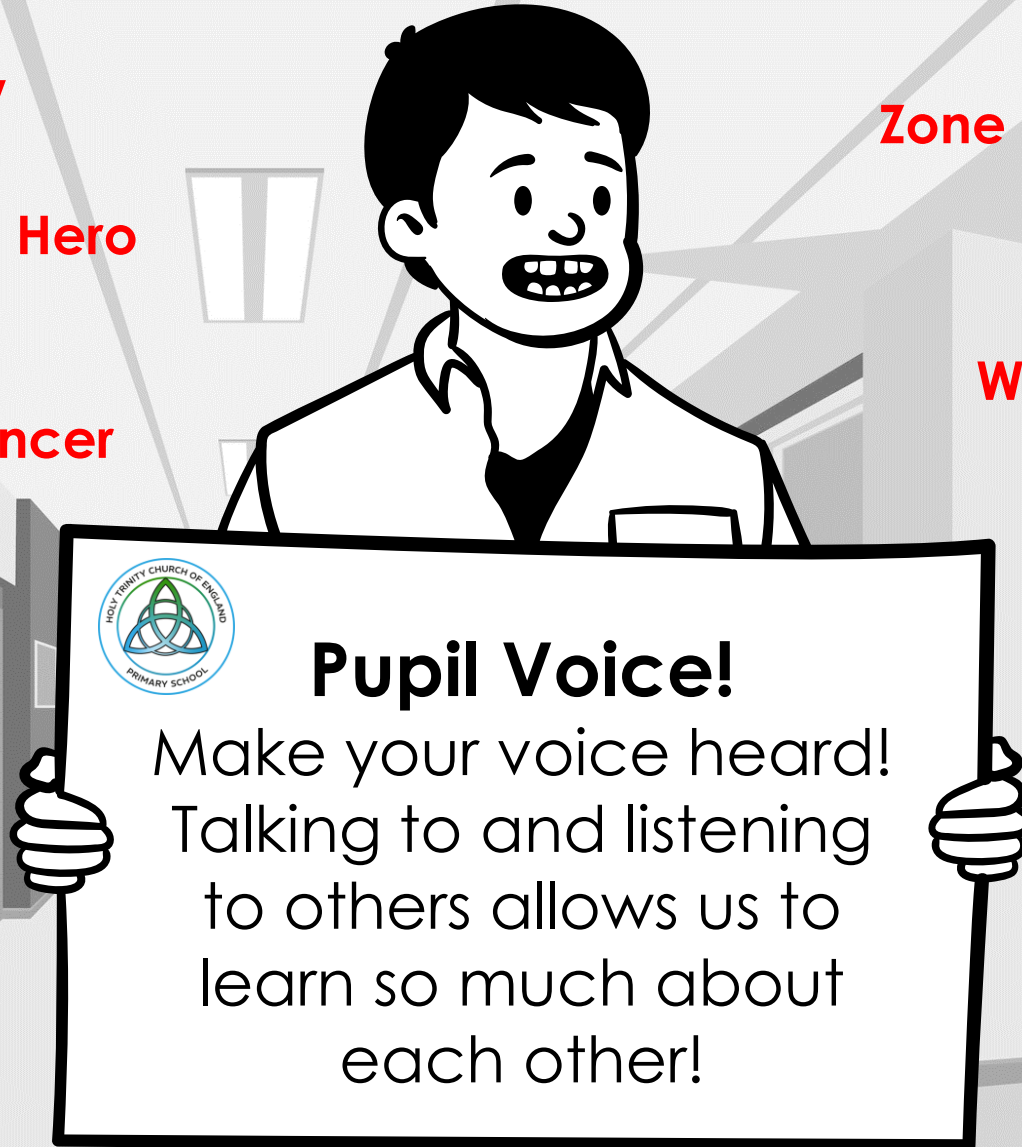
