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#### Safeguarding

#### What are County Lines?

County lines is a form of criminal exploitation. It is when criminals befriend children, either online of offline, and then manipulate them into drug dealing. The 'lines' refer to mobile phones that are used to control a young person who is delivering drugs, often to towns outside their home county.

#### **How County Lines Work**

Young people are recruited by a gang member(s) and lured in with gifts and rewards such as alcohol, cigarettes, clothes or money. Young people are then made to carry out tasks such as 'dropping off' bags of drugs or cash. They recruit young people who are not known to the police to travel between areas to move drugs and money, The gang members then escalate to intimidation, threats towards the young people and their family. The abuse the young person and their family may be subject can include physical, emotional and even sexual abuse. A mobile phone line is used by the gang to contact the young person to organise the delivery of drugs. This may be known as 'THE LINE'

#### Who is at risk?

Children with SEND. Children from deprived areas. Children in Care. Children who are excluded from school. Children living in poverty. Children who live in homes where they do not receive adequate care from adults.

#### What can I do if I am worried?

Worries about exploitation and gangs can be stressful. Talk to your child first to understand the situation and if you can help. This may be difficult for your child. They may feel they are protecting you by keeping quiet, especially if someone had threatened them. They might also worry about getting into trouble.

Let them know that there's nothing they can say that will make them you love them less. Reassure them that you can work through things together. You can also get support from:

Local children's services.

Your local social work team.

Childline – online advice, message boards, or speak to someone.

Crimestoppers (0800 555 111) - to report concerns anonymously.

The Mix – support for under-25s.

Talk to Frank – offers advice if you're concerned about your child using drugs.

Designated Safeguarding Team Mrs Sanderson, Mrs Bell-Walker or Mrs Hooks

The police, especially if there is a concern around criminal exploitation.

This week school staff have completed their training on our new SEND Provision Planning System and have begun setting up the new plans and provisions. Once these are in draft we will be in touch to further co-produce and finalise these plans with families. In the meantime, be reassured that SEND Provision continues to be in place to support all learners. If you would like to know more about the new system, we would welcome you to join us for a short demo on **Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> November 5pm**.

Within our graduated approach to SEND, all children with needs identified on the SEND Register will have a Pupil Profile which will be agreed with you and where appropriate your child. In addition to this most children will have a Target Mat to evidence the provision they require which is additional to and different from what is ordinarily available in the universal offer of high quality teaching in class. Fewer children may require more specific support plans such as Behaviour Support Plans, Positive Handling Plans and Risk Assessments in order to identify and meet their needs in school. Children with EHCPs will continue to have their plans and the trackers we have developed alongside these.

We regularly link in with professionals from the Local Authority to ensure we are following best practice in our SEND provision and as a new(ish) member of Team Trinity I am privileged in leading us in fostering these positive working relationships with others.
