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### Safeguarding

A guide to help parents decide whether their child is ready to stay home or go out alone.

### Is it legal to leave a child home alone?

A child who isn't old enough or who doesn't feel comfortable should never be left home alone. There's no legal age a child can be left home alone, but it's against the law to leave a child alone if it puts them at risk $\frac{1}{2}$ . Every child matures differently, so it would be almost impossible to have a "one size fits all" law.

### Checking your child feels safe home alone.

As your child gets older, talk to them about how they feel about being left home alone. If they're worried, work out what parts of being home alone worry them. Do they feel safe in the neighbourhood? Are they afraid of the dark? Talk about anything that's bothering them and discuss a solution. Understanding why they don't feel comfortable will give you an idea of how to help – or why they might not be ready to be left alone.

The NSPCC would always recommend leaving a child younger than 12 years old with family, a friend or in childcare. Read their advice about this below.

### Is your child ready to go out without you?

As your child gets older, it's likely that they'll want to explore going out without you. That might be playing sports with children in your neighbourhood or going into town with friends. When they ask, it can be helpful to find out a few basic facts to help you make the right decision for both of you. You'll also need to ensure they can confidently recall their personal information, in case of an emergency.

### Free online courses

Did you know that North Yorkshire Council run free online courses to support parents of children with SEND? Currently there are booking links for Unlocking Autism (including bespoke courses specific to girls



and those with a Demand Avoidant profile,) Unlocking ADHD and Unlocking Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs. https://nyes.info/Training These courses are run by the same team of professionals we link in with regularly to support best practice in our schools so I do hope you find them supportive.

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If you have any concerns about your child and would like to discuss these, please do approach your child's class teacher in the first instance and they will work with you to identify any next steps together. Myself as SENDCo and Mrs Hooks as Pastoral Lead are also available where supportive.

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
