Happy New Year!

It has been lovely to welcome the children back after the Christmas break. Across the Federation it has felt calm and purposeful with classes enthusiastic and enjoying and enjoying learning. We are delighted to welcome Mrs Lockwood to the team who will be supporting our Year 5 team. Mrs Wood, a regular supply teacher at Trinity, also joined us this week, she commented positively on the attitude and behaviour across the school.

Training Day

On Monday 8th January Holy Trinity hosted a number of schools from our academy LDLT ([Leeds Diocesan Learning Trust](#)). As part of the day over 140 staff attended Safeguarding training hosted by [Clennell Education Services](#). Clennell works with the trust to provide training and support for schools and leadership to ensure they fulfil their safeguarding responsibilities. During the day Mark Forster, the trust's new Director for Education outlined his vision and priorities for LDLT as he takes up his new role from January 2024. Mark also visited the federation on Wednesday alongside Richard Noake our CEO to meet pupils and staff.

Communication

This term we are trialling alternating the federation newsletter and class newsletters. The federation newsletter shares information, news and updates from both schools and will be sent to parents fortnightly by email. Class newsletters update parents with class learning and special events and these will be available to view on our website. Links to your class pages will be sent fortnightly via an app message.

Attendance Absence Reporting Reminder

If your child is absent from school due to illness, please telephone school on 01765 602858 and inform the office staff ideally between 8.30 and 9am. If your child's illness lasts for more than one day, you must phone school daily and inform us why your child is still absent. If your child's illness lasts longer than 48hrs and you have not already done so, we advise you to seek medical attention. If you do not inform school and we cannot make contact, a member of the leadership team may visit your home to check all is well and ask why your child is absent from school. It is very important that you contact school and inform us why your child is absent. If we do not hear from you, we will be concerned and may make a referral to outside agencies.

Be a Zero Hero Ripon Walk to School Day

Our school is proudly taking part in this half term's Ripon Walk to School Day. Mrs Knight (PE Lead) would like to invite all pupils to take part in a walk to school day on Friday 2nd February, to try to become a 'zero hero' by encouraging all pupils to walk, cycle, bus or 'park and stride' the last mile to school to help protect the planet. Park and stride is where parents park sooner than usual and students walk the last part to school. We do what we can, when we can and every mile counts!

Safeguarding

What is CPOMS ?

CPOMS stands for Child Protection Online Monitoring System and is used by school for monitoring child protection, safeguarding and pastoral and welfare issues. At Holy Trinity CPOMS provides our safeguarding team with a system to help with the management of child protection, behavioural issues, bullying and special educational Every member of staff across the federation has an obligation to report any concerns which they may have. CPOMS allows this information to be recorded in a central repository and have relevant people alerted immediately. Whilst all staff can record information on CPOMS only members of the leadership team have access to the incidents recorded. Senior leaders are able to build a chronology around a student and can produce reports for external agencies, case conference meetings, anonymised data for Governors and other professionals very easily.
