#### **Curriculum Evening**

Thank you to everyone who attended our Learning Means The World curriculum evening on Wednesday. The event was very well attended by parents – we will be organising more information evenings across the year. The next evening will be on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> November 6pm – 7pm. The focus will be SATS which stands for **S**tandard **A**ssessment **T**ests. SATS are administered by primary schools and measure children's educational achievement at the end of their key stage 2 education; in primary schools, this is at the end of Year 2 and 6. Year 2 SATS are based on teacher assessment and do not involve such formal testing. Year 6 staff will explain all about the SATS process, what it entails in school and how you can help at home. It will be a really good opportunity to ask any questions you may have about the upcoming tests. The evening is aimed at Year 6 parents, however all parents are welcome to attend.

On Thursday 5th October at 2.45pm, Year 6 will be holding a special assembly to celebrate our time away on residential. It will be a time to look at pictures of the children's time away as well as hearing some stories of what we got up to! Safeguarding

#### **Keeping Children Safe in Education**

All staff have completed their statutory annual Keeping Children Safe In Education Safeguarding training. <u>Keeping</u> <u>Children Safe In Education</u> is statutory guidance that schools and colleges in England must have regard to when carrying out their duties to safeguard and promote the welfare of children. It is essential that everybody working at Holy Trinity understands their safeguarding responsibilities. This year, the updated guidance includes new roles and responsibilities managing filtering and monitoring systems to keep children safe online. We are currently reviewing filtering and monitoring provision in line with the new guidance to ensure that any alert is managed swiftly. At the next meeting of the school Local Academy Council, governors will scrutinise the school Filtering and Monitoring policy and procedures.

#### Laver Class

In our Learning Means the World in Laver class and Y1 this week, we have been thinking about bullying. We enjoyed a tricky challenge of squeezing a tube of toothpaste and then trying to get the toothpaste back in the tube. We realised we couldn't do it! We used this to help us think about the idea of being unkind or bullying someone, helping us understand that once unkind things have been said or done they can't be put back where they came from, just like the toothpaste!

#### **Emotional Resilience Team**

The Emotional Health and Resilience Team offer a service for 6-19 years olds experiencing low to moderate level emotional health issues. Children, young people and families will be offered face to face or virtual support as part of their service. The team includes a skill mix of Emotional Health and resilience Nurses, Psychological Wellbeing Practitioners and Family Health practitioners.

The team are trained to deliver evidence based 1-1 short term interventions to support:

- Low mood
- Anger
- Anxiety
- Self-esteem
- Building resilience
- Managing Emotions
- Behaviour Management linked to emotional health concern.
