






Jeans for Genes

Training Day

Parents often wonder what happens during a school training day when staff spend a whole day without pupils. Training days are used for staff professional development linked to priorities on the School Development and Improvement Plan.

On Friday, teachers attended Subject Leader training led by Kathy Salmon from Dimensions Curriculum. We focused on the concepts of foundation subjects (i.e. Science, Geography, History, Art, DT, Music, PSHCE, Computing and Spanish) agreeing our subject specific rationale and intent. Subject leaders explored the components and composites of their individual subjects — in essence ensuring the themes taught cover the national curriculum in appropriate detail. Leaders planned how they monitor teaching and learning to ensure pupils secure essential knowledge and skills for each subject. We also explored Learning Lexicon: an approach Learning Means The World uses to ensure progression of essential generic learning vocabulary.

Meanwhile, teaching assistant professional development focused on phonic training - all teaching assistants have completed the full programme of Little Wandle training which enables them to support phonic teaching effectively and skilfully. In addition to this, teaching assistants participated in training related to age-specific aspects of the Little Wandle programme; for example, 'Foundations for Phonics' in Nursery and 'Catch Up' for supporting those pupils in KS2 who benefit from further phonic input. In the afternoon, Mrs Cope delivered an introduction to Autism for our teaching assistants to ensure a whole school understanding of one of the areas of SEND often identified in our school. Ongoing professional development for our teaching assistants is key to meeting the needs of all pupils and regular opportunities for this will continue throughout the year.



Our newly appointed midday supervisors and teaching assistants also attended paediatric first aid training. The school Admin Team also completed role specific training.
