Dear families,

Welcome Back

We were delighted to welcome our pupils back to school earlier this week! There is a calm purposeful atmosphere across the federation as pupils and staff settle into new classrooms and routines. The children look extremely smart; thank you to parents for supporting our uniform policy. School looks very smart too! Thank you to Mr Clarkson and the Bulloughs Cleaning Team alongside an army of contractors who worked hard all summer to ensure both schools were ready for the new term.

As we returned to school we were heartbroken to learn of the tragic death of Ihor Bartienieva, who joined our year 1 class after arriving from the Ukraine. Ihor was a popular member of the Trinity community. Ihor had boundless energy and enthusiasm; pupils were drawn to his chatty, charismatic character. Mrs Calland-Brooke, said 'Ihor will be remembered by his classmates as a funny, chatty little boy who was loved by us all. We were all in awe of this little spark of joy who really brought something special to our class.' Our thoughts and prayers are with Ihor's family and friends.

This sad news has deeply affected many within our community, and we are all now attempting to come to terms with our loss together. We will be working with Just 'B' to access support for those affected by the tragedy. Just 'B' is a specialist emotional wellbeing and bereavement support service, working across the Harrogate district, as well as more widely across Yorkshire and the UK. It is part of a family of services, including Herriot Hospice Homecare and Saint Michael's Hospice.

- Just 'B' is available to support members of the community in Ripon and across the Harrogate district impacted by Sunday's road traffic incident.
- Expert support is available for those impacted by the incident on (01423) 856 799, 8am-8pm, seven days a week; or alternatively drop-into Holy Trinity Community Church Hub, HG4 2EY Monday (11th) 1.30-6.30pm and Wednesday (13th) 9am-5pm. This is available to all children, young people and adults. A translator can be made available if required.
